Please remember when riding at Bluff Point, Hammonassett, Chatfield Hollow, and other **State Parks: These parks** are busy and get a lot of non-horse-friendly use. Be considerate. Pass walkers and other trail users slowly and respectfully. Do not ride where you see NO ANIMALS OF NO HORSES signs posted. The boardwalks on the **Shoreline Greenway** Trail in Hammonassett, for example, are not horse safe. No horses are allowed on the beach at Hammonassett from April 1 to November 1. Horses are never allowed on the beach or in the picnic area at Chatfield Pond. PLEASE remove any manure from roads, trails, and beaches in State Parks. We want to keep these areas open to equestrians!

On high-use trails in the state forest, please dismount and kick/ scatter manure off the trail so the kids don't walk in it and track it into Mom's SUV!

Remove all manure from parking areas and trail heads!



# Workshop Descriptions

9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.

"Meat Goat Management" presented by members of the Red Rock 4-H Club. In this workshop you will be presented with an overview of meat goat, safe handling, general health and kidding, confirmation, and nutrition and housing.

"An Informational Program on Public Act 490: Connecticut's Land Use Value Assessment Law for Farm Land, Forest Land, Open Space and Maritime Heritage Land" Joan Nichols, current Director of Member Relations and Community outreach of the CT Farm Bureau will provide a presentation on Public Act 490, an often 'land-saving' state act for CT landowners. This presentation will cover what PA 490 is, who it affects, how to apply and will field the various questions dealing with this opportunity.

"Brackish Groundwater— an Alternate Supply Source in the U.S." Craig Brown, Research Hydrologist at the USGS, will discuss brackish groundwater as an alternate resource for use in irrigation, livestock, cooling, etc., in light of increased water demand and projected climate change.

# Workshop Descriptions 10:45 a.m. to 12:15 p.m.

"Holistic Horse Care" presented by Sara Muirhead, HoofCares Barefoot Trimmer and Alternative Wellness Practitioner. This workshop will discuss holistic approaches to horse care & management, including preventative health & parasite management and diet & nutrition. Sara will also demonstrate her approach to balancing horses chemically, physically & emotionally, using reflexology, orthobionomy, homeopathy & craniosacral work.

"Going Batty" Laura Cisneros, Ph.D, Natural Resources Conservation Academy, UCONN Department of Natural Resources and the Environment, will present a lecture on Connecticut bats and their importance as pest control. Also, participants will learn how to contribute to bat conservation efforts through the use of bat houses and neighborhood monitoring programs.

"Forest Tree Identification" presented by Tom Worthley, Assistant Extension Professor at the University of Connecticut Cooperative Extension Service and the University of Connecticut Department of Natural Resources and the Environment. Tom will share his expert knowledge on the forest's largest inhabitants, teaching us how to identify different tree species by looking at the tree's shape and noting features on the twigs and bark.

# Workshop Descriptions 12:45 p.m. to 2:15 p.m.

"Mustang Madness: The Best Horse You May Ever Own!" Geoff Goodson and his 2015 Extreme Mustang Makeover TOP 10 Mustang mare, Stella, will provide insight into America's symbol of Freedom and Pride, the American Mustang! Geoff will talk in great detail about the incredible trainability of the Mustangs, their incredible constitution and versatility. Learn about the Mustang Heritage Foundation and the work that they do with the BLM to promote Mustang adoption in the U.S., and information about Mustang Makeover and how you can compete and /or adopt a Mustang of your own!

"Chainsaw Safety and Sharpening" A presentation by UMAINE graduate and CT arborist, Hank Kay. Hank, a member of the UMAINE Woodsman team and current tree services manager will provide a presentation on chainsaw safety, equipment, upkeep, and operation.

"Avian Flu Update" Natalie Cohen, APHIS USDA, will report on the impact and response to the most recent Avian Influenza outbreak, as well as the current USDA response plan and biosecurity tips you can implement to keep your own flock safe from this dangerous, contagious disease that has had a devastating impact on the entire industry, from poultry producers to prices to local grocery stores.
